On Monday, July 18, 1983 S/A M. D. McGinniss and Marietta Police Detective Parker met with Attorney at Law, Clayton Sinclair, Jr., at 301 Equitable Building, 100 Peachtree St., NW Atlanta, GA and his clients Winthrop Lennox Stephenson and Pamela Stephenson reference the recovered 1981 Porsche from Michael Scudero. The purpose of the meeting was to ascertain how Lennox Stephenson and his wife, Pamela Stephenson, came into possession of the stolen Porsche. Prior to questioning the Stephensons S/A McGinniss advised them of the Miranda rights as required by law in the presence of their attorney, and both Mr. and Mrs. Stephenson filled out and signed a waiver certificate acknowledging their understanding of the Miranda rights, also in the presence of their attorney. (See attached.)

Mrs. Stephenson advised S/A McGinniss that on June 30, 1983, Thursday morning, she was contacted by a white male named Chris Piersall at her apartment in Atlanta. Pamela Stephenson advised the agent that she first met Chris Piersall at the Northlake Mall on June 29, at which time he identified himself as an automobile broker and advised her that she could purchase a BMW or Porsche at a cheap price.

On June 30 Mr. and Mrs. Stephenson advised, that Chris Piersall drove to their apartment at 2611 C Oak Shadow Court, Atlanta, GA, with another male. Piersall and another unidentified white male pulled up in a 1981 gold Porsche and a BMW. The Stephensons talked with Piersall about the purchase of the Porsche and agreed that the total cost would be \$5300. The Stephensons advised that had only \$2900 in cash to give Piersall and Piersall advised that that would be alright and they could finance the rest through his company.

After the Stephensons gave Piersall the \$2900 in cash Pamela Stephenson received a receipt in her name for \$2900 as the down payment on a 1981 turbo
